ABIDE IN CHRIST → THE IN-DEPTH STUDY

The heart of our national strategy lies in a God-sized goal of **one million multiplying disciplemakers living and discipling together among the lost by 2030** and three Faith Initiatives: **Abide**, **Ignite**, and **Multiply**. The success of this strategy hinges on abiding deeper in Christ, for apart from Him we can do nothing (John 15:5).

OBJECTIVE: To grow deeper in our dependence on Jesus and His Word—as individuals, in community, and on an organizational level—resulting in biblical fruitfulness

LEARNING OBJECTIVES: Staff will be able to:

1. Define “abiding in Christ” and support it from Scripture.
2. Describe the role and relationship of the Father, Jesus, and the believer in abiding.
3. Explain the connection between abiding in Christ, our fruitfulness, prayer life, discipleship, joy, community and glorifying God.
4. Establish stronger practices of abiding in Christ which deepen our dependence on Jesus and His Word.

BIBLE STUDY:

1. Read and meditate on John 15:1-17 in your favorite version.
2. Read it in two or three other versions.
3. Highlight key words and phrases, look up word definitions, link related thoughts (use the attached study guide as desired).
4. Look up related cross-references (including Psalm 1, 92:12-15; Jeremiah 17:7-8)
5. Answer the following questions (on other paper if needed):
 - Define “abiding in Christ.”
 - What is the believer’s role in abiding in Christ?
 - Why is abiding in Christ important?
 - What changes to your practices should you make to lead to a deepening dependence on Jesus and His Word as a result of this study?

VERSE 4

ESV > Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me.

Live in me. Make your home in me just as I do in you. In the same way that a branch can't bear grapes by itself but only by being joined to the vine, you can't bear fruit unless you are joined with me.

ESV

If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned.

Anyone who separates from me is deadwood, gathered up and thrown on the bonfire.

ESV > If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.

But if you make yourselves at home with me and my words are at home in you, you can be sure that whatever you ask will be listened to and acted upon.

One thing I ask of the LORD, this is what I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to seek him in his temple. PSALM 27:4

Now when Daniel learned that the decree had been published, he went home to his upstairs room where the windows opened towards Jerusalem. Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to his God, just as he had done before. DANIEL 6:10

Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. Simon and his companions went to look for him. And when they found him, they exclaimed: "Everyone is looking for you!" MARK 1:35-37

"Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of men." MATTHEW 4:19

I tell you the truth, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. JOHN 12:24 (SEE ALSO MARK 1:17, LUKE 5:10)
